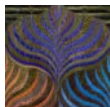

### CLASS LEVEL – CONFIDENT BEGINNER

### WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION

In class we will explore a unique way of accomplishing seemingly complex machine appliqué by making templates for preparation, and assembling our block over a diagram. Our time will be spent more in preparation and assembly, and our machines will come into use toward the end of class (or even after). Students may choose between the block pictured below and a somewhat simplified version, patterns of which are both provided. This is great fun!



### SUPPLY LIST

- Pinable personal ironing board (in which pins will stand straight up firmly). This can be a lightweight board with a layer of foam and batting covered with muslin, or a few layers of foam core glued together, or a piece of insulation covered with muslin, or a purchased board e.g. June Tailor's Cut and Press board. It should be about 12" x 18". (June Tailor's Cut & Press board available by special order at Stitchin' Post.)
- Personal craft iron, if you have one. (Mighty Steam Iron available at Stitchin' Post.)
- Pins
- Fabric scissors
- Pencil/pen
- Spray sizing/light starch
- Cutting mat (medium)
- Sewing machine (zig zag capable, or stitching can be completed later)
- Invisible polyester thread
- Cotton for bobbins
- Fabric: this block contains a main color (which gradates and varies block to block) and a background color (brown in the picture).
  - For technique in class, two fabrics would be perfectly adequate (1/2 yd each, total), but expanding either color to a group in full or partial graduation is lovely and more fun. As long as there is contrast between the background and main color, your block will be successful.

**KEEP GOING...THERE'S MORE...**

- For best results your fabrics should read fairly solid. Bring enough to complete two blocks, just in case.
- \$1 kit fee, payable to instructor. Kit contains glue, knife, template material and pattern pages.

**CANCELLATIONS:** Cancellation must be made **45 days** prior to the first day of class for a refund, less a \$25 non-refundable registration deposit. Cancellation less than 45 days before the first day of class forfeits all registration monies paid. On occasion, Stitchin' Post will cancel a class due to lack of registration. If Stitchin' Post cancels this class, you may take a store credit or a refund. To minimize the chance that you will purchase your fabrics and supplies prior to a class that could cancel, we recommend that you call to confirm that the class has met its minimum enrollment and will go on as scheduled. Our recommendation is that you make class purchases within 45 days of the class start date.
