### WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION

Take the challenge out of the picture and become the creator of your one of a kind pictorial landscape wall quilt. In this 3-day workshop you will learn the basics of designing your pattern and reproducing your personal landscape photo into an art quilt. You will learn June's "paint by number" technique with the use of fusible web. June will help you troubleshooting and will discuss optional finishing techniques.

### INSTRUCTIONS

Choose a clear landscape photo or photos. You will need to have this photo or combination of photos enlarged to the desired size of your wall hanging. A good size is around 18"x24" or 24"x30". Avoid trying to go too big. Have the enlarged photo printed in **black and white** to show the value changes. **A cheaper, thinner grade of paper works best.** Any copy shop with a large machine can do this for you.

### SUPPLY LIST

- Bring your original photo(s) as well as the enlarged photo
- Pencil, eraser fine line Sharpie, and ultrafine line Sharpie pens
- Clear vinyl the size of your enlargement; medium weight, available at JoAnn's or Hobby Lobby
- Lite fusible web, about 3 yards. I like Pellon 805 Wonder Under
- Teflon pressing sheet
- Small, sharp pointed scissors
- Wide blue masking tape
- Colored pencils
- ¾ to 1 yard of background (base) fabric
- Choose a variety of fabrics representing your photo. Batiks are good for this project. Keep in mind texture, scale, and value. Scraps and ¼ yard pieces work well.

CANCELLATIONS: Cancellation must be made **10 days** prior to the first day of class for a refund. Cancellation less than 10 days before the first day of class forfeits all registration monies paid. On occasion, the Stitchin' Post will cancel a class due to lack of registration. If the Stitchin' Post cancels this class, you may take a store credit or a refund. To minimize the chance that you will purchase your fabrics and supplies prior to a class that could cancel, we recommend that you call to confirm that the class has met its minimum enrollment and will go on as scheduled. Our recommendation is that you make class purchases within 10 days of the class start date.
