CLASS LEVEL

INTERMEDIATE

WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION

This workshop offers a new style and technique for creating wool applique art quilts which focus on botanicals. This technique allows for a fresh natural and spontaneous creation of botanical art with wool. Participants will have a choice of re-creating one of three of Leotie's art quilt designs for a \$10 fee; revising them to their own style **OR** create a completely original art work.

INSTRUCTIONS

If you do not use one of Leotie's patterns, please research plants that inspire you esthetically and make an 8.5" x 11" print of images of the plants. It is advisable to pick a genus of plants such as coleus or succulents and locate a collection of different complementary leaves and perhaps flowers that inspire you. Please make copies of a wide variety of plants within the class or genus.

SUPPLY LIST

- Various rich colors of wool for applique – pull from your stash and/or purchase on site. The Stitchin Post will carry several pieces from a local supplier that Leotie uses (Lois Summers). To fabricate a 14" x 37" art quilt you will need approximately 12 different colors of wool.
- Black wool for the background will be available for purchase by the yard at the Stitchin Post
- Sewing machine in good working order (please include the machine's manual, as well)
- 1 yard crinoline
- Fray Check
- 14" x 37" batting (fusible preferred)
- 14" x 37" Cotton backing fabric
- Freezer paper roll
- 18" x 24" Tracing paper pad
- Scissors
- Fabric basting glue
- #12 Weight Sulky Thread
- Embroidery thread (optional)
- Needles for hand sewing
- Regular weight thread

CANCELLATIONS: Cancellation must be made **14 days** prior to the first day of class for a refund. Cancellation less than 14 days before the first day of class forfeits all registration monies paid. On occasion, the Stitchin' Post will cancel a class due to lack of registration. If the Stitchin' Post cancels this class, you may take a store credit or a refund. To minimize the chance that you will purchase your fabrics and supplies prior to a class that could cancel, we recommend that you call to confirm that the class has met its minimum enrollment and will go on as scheduled. Our recommendation is that you make class purchases within 10 days of the class start date.

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
