A 1/4" seam allowance is used throughout.**

## *Materials Needed and Cutting Instructions*

*(all measurements based on accurate cutting, 1/4" seam allowance, and 42" wide strips)*

All the fabrics are from Blueprint Basics, except the solids – they are Kona Cottons by Robert Kaufman.

<p>2 1/2 yards Kona K001-1019 Black</p> <p>1/2 yard each of the following: AVW-14538-323 Walnut AVW-14539-88 Ice AVW-14540-185 Steel AVW-14540-312 Starry Night AVW-14541-314 Chinese Blue AVW-14542-155 Stone AVW-14542-322 Orange Spice AVW-14543-320 Sangria AVW-14544-325 Celestial</p> <p>Kona K001-1301 Purple Kona K001-199 Cactus Kona K001-411 Leprechaun</p>	<p>From each of the following fabrics cut 6 - 2" X 42" strips. AVW-14543-320 Sangria. Then cut into 14 - 2" x 13 1/2" rectangles. AVW-14544-325 Celestial. Then cut into 14 - 2" x 13 1/2" rectangles. AVW-14540-312 Starry Night. Then cut into 16 - 2" x 13 1/2" rectangles. Kona K001-199 Cactus. Then cut into 16 - 2" x 13 1/2" rectangles.</p> <p><b>Cutting Note:</b> If your strips are less than 42" wide, you will need to sew them together into one long lengthwise strip, then cut the 13 1/2" rectangles from this long strip.</p> <p>From each of the following fabrics cut 7 - 2" X 42" strips. AVW-14542-322 Orange Spice. Then cut into 20 - 2" x 13 1/2" rectangles. AVW-14541-314 Chinese Blue. Then cut into 16 - 2" x 13 1/2" rectangles. AVW-14539-88 Ice. Then cut into 18 - 2" x 13 1/2" rectangles. AVW-14542-155 Stone. Then cut into 14 - 2" x 13 1/2" rectangles. AVW-14538-323 Walnut. Then cut into 14 - 2" x 13 1/2" rectangles. AVW-14540-185 Steel. Then cut into 20 - 2" x 13 1/2" rectangles.</p> <p>From the following fabric cut 4 - 2" X 42" strips. Kona K001-411 Leprechaun. Then cut into 10 - 2" x 13 1/2" rectangles.</p>
<p>To complete the quilt, you will also need:</p> <p>1/2 yard Kona K001-1019 Black for binding</p> <p>5 yards backing</p> <p>60" x 88" quilt batting</p>	<p>From the following fabric cut 5 - 2" X 42" strips. Kona K001-1301 Purple. Then cut into 14 - 2" x 13 1/2" rectangles.</p> <p>From the Kona K001-1019 Black cut 6 - 2 3/8" x 42" strips. Then cut into 93 - 2 3/8" x 2 3/8" squares. Cut these squares once on the diagonal into half-square triangles. </p> <p>Also cut 2 - 9 7/8" x 42" strips. Then cut into 5 - 9 7/8" x 9 7/8" squares. Cut these squares once on the diagonal into half-square triangles.</p> <p>Cut 2 - 18 1/2" x 42" strips. From one strip cut 1 - 18 1/2" x 19 1/2" rectangle and cut 1 - 2 1/2" x 18 1/2" rectangle. Also cut 1 - 18 1/2" x 32 1/2" strip from the remaining strip.</p>

## Sewing Instructions

1. Using each of the fabrics, stack in two piles, putting the same number of rectangles in each pile. Repeat for each of the fabrics.

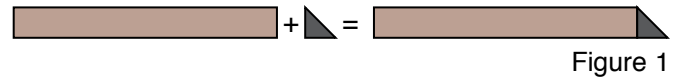

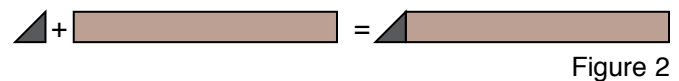

Using the half-square triangles, sew a half-square triangle as shown to one pile of rectangles.

### Figure 1.

Press toward the rectangles.

Sew a half-square triangle to the opposite end of the other pile of rectangles.

### Figure 2.

Press toward the rectangles.

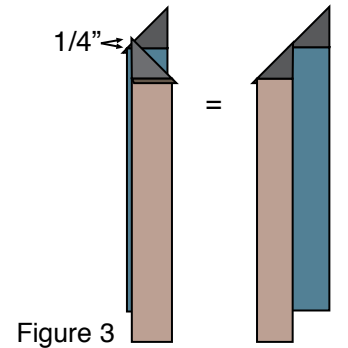

2. Starting with Unit 1, select 6 fabrics with the half-square triangles on the right hand end.

Sew these together as shown, place the second unit on top of the first unit right sides together and off-setting the second unit 1/4".

Press.

Repeat, joining the units together, and off-setting the unit being added each time.

Press.

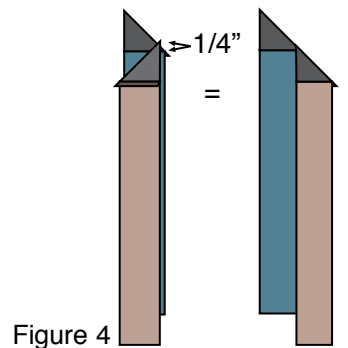

Using the same fabrics with the half-square triangles on the left hand end, sew together as before and keeping the fabrics in the same order.

### Figure 4.

Press.

Sew a large half-square triangle to the top of each unit as shown.

### Figure 5.

Press.

3. Refer to the illustration, and using your ruler as shown, trim each of the units to 9 1/2" wide.

You will be trimming along the opposite side from the small half-square triangles.

### Figure 6.

Sew the unit together as shown in Figure 7.

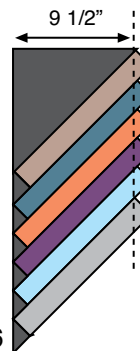

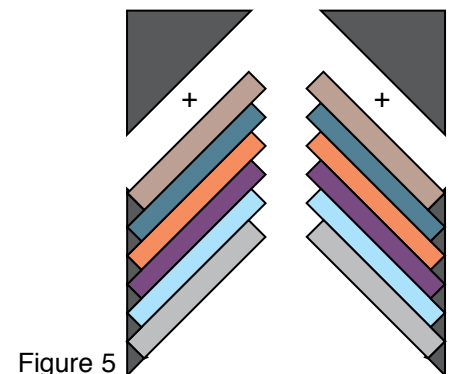

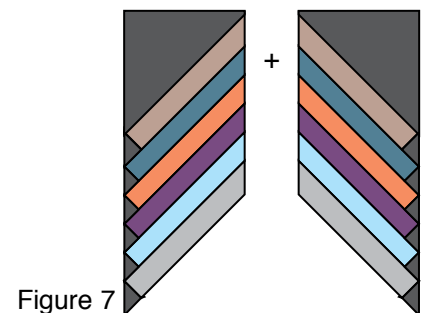

4. Repeat step 3, making each of the remaining units.  
 Unit 2 uses 9 fabrics, Unit 3 uses 15 fabrics,  
 Unit 4 uses 24 fabrics, and Unit 5 uses 39 fabrics.

Note: on Unit 3, the large half-square triangles are sewn to the opposite end of the unit.

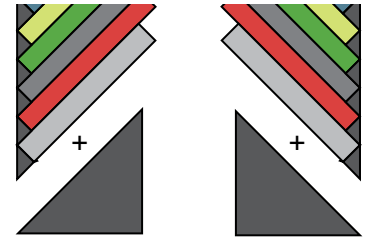

Trim each of the units to  $9\frac{1}{2}$ ".

5. Referring to the Quilt Assembly diagram, sew the  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $18\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle to the bottom of Unit 5.

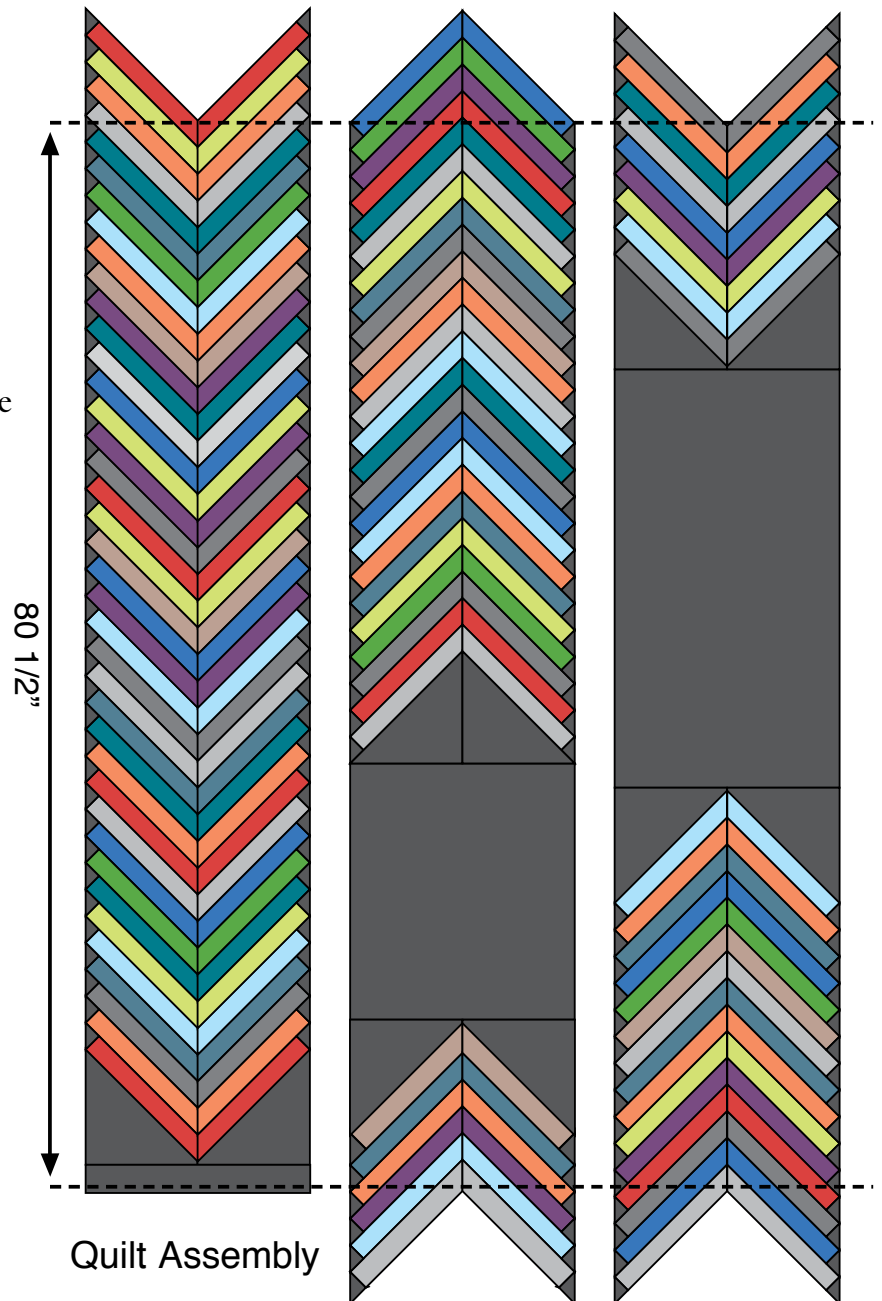
To sew Row 2 together, sew Unit 4 to the  $18\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $19\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle to Unit 1. Press.

Sew Unit 2 to the  $18\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $32\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle to Unit 3 for Row 3. Press.

Trim each of the rows to  $80\frac{1}{2}$ " – or wait until the three rows are sewn together and then trim.

Sew the rows together. Press.

6. Layer, quilt, and finish the quilt.  
 I quilted swirling vines on the black background sections, and vertical lines in the pieced sections.
